(b) Block Watch Program

Ms. Sandy de Schaetzen, Anmore Block Watch resident coordinator provided an overview the Block Watch program in Anmore.

Discussion points included:

- Need for more Block Watch captains that can coordinate communication amongst neighbours there are currently 7-8 Block Watch captains in Anmore
- The need to provide an alert to Block Watch is not considered necessary for every incident
- Privacy considerations must be followed when RCMP considers releasing information and investigation processes must be followed

- Importance of reporting "When you see something say something"
- Whether social media could be used to communicate
- What appears to be criminal activity is sometimes animal activity (eg. bears breaking into cars)

Action Item: Invite RCMP representative to next Public Safety Committee meeting

(c) Committee Priorities / Meeting Schedule

Committee members discussed public safety within the community and areas of focus for the Committee.

Discussion points included:

- Whether speed watch could come to Anmore
- Whether a resident neighbourhood watch program could be implemented in Anmore and what the model would be
- Anmore RCMP model and policing levels in Anmore
