ABOUT THE VILLAGE OF ANMORE



The Village of Anmore is a small community surrounded by nature in the Metro Vancouver region of B.C. With an estimated population of 2,300 in 2020, Anmore is becoming more widely known because of our proximity to a multitude of outdoor activities and beautiful surroundings.

The focus of the Village is to create a welcoming environment for all residents and visitors.

As part of encouraging community engagement and involvement, this New Residents Handbook provides an overview of the community and tips for how to connect with the many programs and services in the area.

The Village of Anmore was incorporated on Dec. 7, 1987 and continues to grow from our rich history.

The origins of modern community life in what is today the Village of Anmore can be traced back to 1915 with the launch of the Farmer's Institute and companion Ladies' Guild, the area's first community organizations.

Anmore was also home to Canadian icon Margaret "Ma" Murray and her husband from 1917 to 1934.



Renowned pioneering newswoman Margaret "Ma" Murray made her home in Anmore for more than 15 years.

As a small community, Anmore continues to evolve and adapt with its surroundings while still embracing the values of community and togetherness and, in more recent decades, nature and the environment.

Garbage and Recycling

- Sarbage and recycling services: Anmore's services include curbside collection of garbage, recycling and organics. Find detailed information, waste-reduction resources and the current collection schedule at anmore.com (Services section > Garbage & Recycling Collection services)

Anmore's beautiful, semi-rural setting makes it a great location to enjoy the outdoors. The Village maintains Spirit Park and multiple trails, many that connect to neighbouring trail systems. We're also very proud of our community and work with volunteers to maintain our public spaces.

Parking and Traffic

- > Street parking and parking permits: Parking on Village streets is restricted depending on the street and the time of year. View the Parking Regulation and Enforcement Bylaw at anmore.com (Village Hall section > Bylaws). If you are planning a private event where additional street parking is required, a date-specific parking permit may be purchased at the Village Hall. Find the Temporary Parking Permit Application at anmore.com (Business & Development section > Municipal Forms).
- Summer lake traffic: During the summer months, the Village of Anmore sees a large increase in traffic due to its proximity to Buntzen Lake and Belcarra Regional Park. The Village manages the increased traffic in a variety of ways, including roadblocks, parking enforcement and increased signage. Information on all these initiatives is communicated to residents via email and social media.

Property Taxes and Utilities

The Village of Anmore collects property taxes once per year in July. Utilities are collected twice per year in the spring and in the fall. Find detailed Information at anmore.com (Business & Development section > Finance Department).

Public Works

- Road maintenance: Work includes fixing potholes, repairs, snow removal and managing roadworks projects.
- > Trail conservation: Public Works crews help keep trails safe and accessible
- Water: Anmore's water comes from Metro Vancouver via Port Moody. Once a year, to ensure water quality, the Village performs maintenance and flushes all the water mains. Service notifications will arrive in the mail.





RESIDENT RESPONSIBILITIES



Being an owner or resident of Anmore comes with certain responsibilities. These include:

Bears and wildlife: Living surrounded by nature involves being respectful of wildlife and following some key safety measures, including consistently removing attractants (see below), keeping dogs leashed and reporting wildlife concerns to the BC Conservation Office at 1-877-952-7277 (RAPP) or text #7277 (available 24/7).

Reduce wildlife attractants by following Anmore's garbage and recycling bylaw requirements and other tips:

- · Clean carts regularly and store in a secure location (e.g. garage/shed).
- · If you can't store carts in a garage or shed, freeze food scraps until collection day.
- · Wash recyclables before putting them in your blue bin.
- · Pick ripened fruit and berries.
- · Feed pets indoors.
- Only place carts at the curbside after 5:30 a.m. on collection day, and lock and store them by 10 p.m. that day.
- · Unlock containers at the curbside on collection day.
- Ensure cart lids and locks function properly. For repairs or replacement, email village.hall@anmore.com.
- > **Building permits**: Building permits are required for any new construction, additions, alterations or renovations to a structure. For information, go to anmore.com (Business & Development Section > Building Department).
- > Campfire permits: No outdoor burning is permitted in Anmore without a permit. For information, visit anmore.com (Our Community Section > Community Safety > Wildfire Information).

RESIDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- > **Diverting waste from the landfill**: Compost and recycle to reduce what you send to the landfill. For information and resources, go to anmore.com (Services section > Garbage & Recycling Collection).
- Pets: Anmore is proud to be a pet-friendly community. But, as with all things, having a pet comes with a community responsibility and a need to respect your neighbours. For example, dog owners are expected to leash and pick up after their pets. Find rules and licensing information at anmore.com (Our Community > Parks, Trails & Public Spaces section).
- Septic maintenance: The majority of Anmore properties use a septic system for sewage management. Residents own their own septic systems and are responsible for all maintenance. It is important to have your system inspected and serviced annually. For more information, visit healthlinkbc.ca (Services and Resources section > HealthLinkBC files > Maintenance and Operation of Sewage Disposal Systems).
- Smoking: Smoking (including tobacco and marijuana) and vaping of any kind are prohibited in any outdoor public space (including parks and trails) and inside or within 7.5 metres of any place or building where people assemble (not including private homes). For information, see anmore.com (Village Hall section > Bylaws).
- > Water leaks: Residents are responsible for testing for water leaks, and for fees incurred due to leaks. For information, visit anmore.com (Services section > Public Works).



Community Facilities



Future Anmore Community Hub

This new community facility, to be located on the existing Village Hall site, will house the Village of Anmore Municipal Hall and provide expanded community space. The community room will serve several functions,

Community Waste and Recycling

While not all waste can be included in curbside collection, there are other options to recycle household materials such as Styrofoam, electronics, small appliances and plastic bags, or to dispose of large amounts of garbage.

- Coquitlam Recycling and Waste Centre (formerly Coquitlam Transfer Station: Provides a recycling area (free drop-off) and garbage disposal (fees apply). Info: 604-681-5600 or metrovancouver.org (Services section > Solid Waste > Solid Waste & Recycling Facilities).
- Encorp BC (Return-It Depot): Accepts a range of recyclable items, including refundable bottles and cans, as well as plastic bags, electronics, cardboard and Styrofoam. Info: 1-800-330-9767 or visit return-it.ca. Closest depots are located at 2560 Barnet Hwy., Coquitlam (all services) and 2409 Clarke St., Port Moody (beverage containers only).

- · If possible, do not park vehicles in the streets.
- \cdot $\;$ Place garbage bins on the sidewalk or driveway, not on the road.
- · Watch for snowploughs when exiting your driveway.

Creek Sensitivity

There are three main creeks running through the Village of Anmore: Mossom Creek, Schoolhouse Creek and Anmore Creek. These are environmentally sensitive areas with fish habitat. For locations, view the Anmore Municipal Map at anmore.com (Business & Development section > Municipal Maps).
